The Wise Men Reading Comprehension

Jesus was born in the town of Bethlehem in Judea during the time when Herod was king. After Jesus was born, some wise men from the east came to Jerusalem. They asked, “Where is the baby who was born to be the king of the Jews? We saw his star in the east. We came to worship him.”

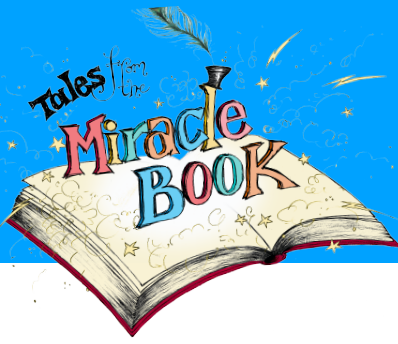
When King Herod heard about this new king of the Jews, he was troubled. And all the people in Jerusalem were worried too. Herod called a meeting of all the leading priests and teachers of the law. He asked them where the Christ would be born. They answered, “In the town of Bethlehem in Judea. The prophet wrote about this in the Scriptures:

‘But you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, you are important
among the rulers of Judah. A ruler will come from you.
He will be like a shepherd for my people, the Israelites.’”

Then Herod had a secret meeting with the wise men from the east. He learned from them the exact time they first saw the star.

Then Herod sent the wise men to Bethlehem. He said to them, “Go and look carefully to find the child. When you find him, come tell me. Then I can go worship him too.”

The wise men heard the king and then left. They saw the same star they had seen in the east. It went before them until it stopped above the place where the child was. When the wise men saw the star, they were filled with joy. They went to the house where the child was and saw him with his mother, Mary. They bowed down and worshiped the child. They opened the gifts they brought for him. They gave him treasures of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. But God warned the wise men in a dream not to go back to Herod. So they went home to their own country by a different way.

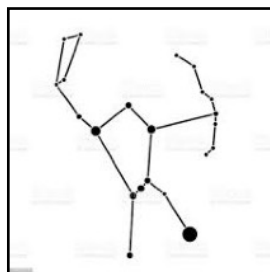
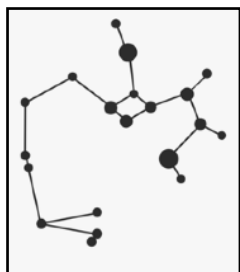
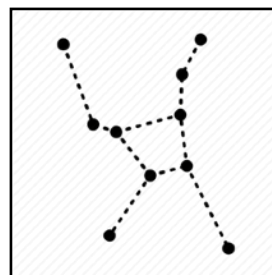
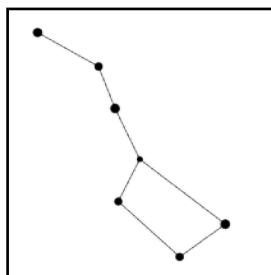
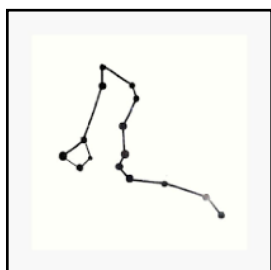


The patterns that stars make are called 'constellations'.

Drama games

'Wise men and camels' (*energy game*)

Get class to get into pairs. In pairs assign names: one of them as 'Wise man' and the other as 'camel'.



Get into a circle with camel kneeling in front of their wise man. The leader of the game then calls out either "wise men follow the star" or "camels follow the star". When "wise men follow the star" is called then the wise men have to run around the outside of the circle clockwise. When leader of the game calls out "Star!" the wise men have to get back to their space behind their camel as soon as possible. The last person to get back to their space gets both themselves and their camel out. The same happens for when camels run around the circle on the words "camels follow the star!". Make sure that they don't go back on themselves when leader calls out "Star".

"Do you have a room?" (*imagination game*)

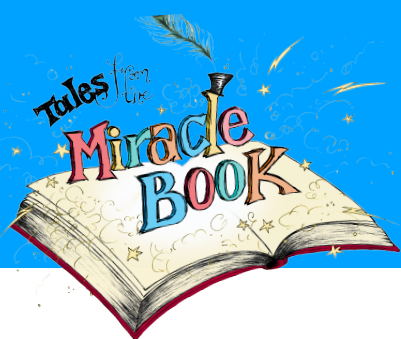
In the film the innkeepers gave their reasons to not give Mary and Joseph a room. But this time the innkeepers can be as imaginative as they like! This exercise gets the children to use their imagination and develop improvisation skills.

Get the class to stand in a circle. Get two people in the middle of the circle, one is Mary and one is Joseph. The rest of the children are the innkeepers. Mary and Joseph have to go up to different children in the circle and ask if they have a room. The child then has to become the innkeeper and give them the best excuse they can think of for why they don't have enough room without laughing.

Encourage the children to create a funny character, think of how they would look, what their voice or physicality would be like.

The winner is the one with the best excuse and who didn't crack a smile/laugh!





Easy Nativity Play Drama Freeze Frames p.1

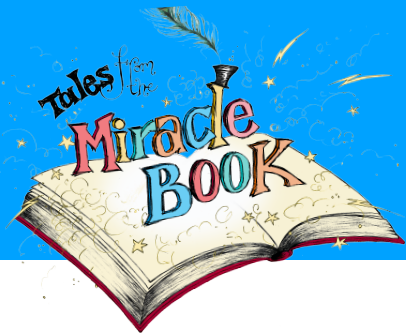
1. Get children into groups of the appropriate numbers (Group 1 needs to be smaller than group 4). In their groups each person should become a character in the scene (or a narrator to read out the title of the scene).
2. The children will need to decide who is which character in their scene.
3. Pupils can discuss how the character might have felt. The person playing the character then chooses to 'freeze' in an emotion or feeling that their character might express in that moment of the story.
4. For additional work you can ask older children to speak out an emotion/ feeling word (just one word) when they're showing their freeze frame to explain how the character may be feeling at this time.
5. Ask each group to show their freeze frame pictures to the class in order of the story (NB- group 3's last freeze frame comes in the middle of group 4s freeze frames) and you have your own little play. You can always record this to show to parents.

Group 1- 3 or 4 people

1. **An angel tells Mary that she is going to have a baby.** *Mary & Angel*
2. **Mary tells Joseph she's going to have a baby!** *Mary & Joseph*
3. **An angel appears to Joseph in a dream and tells Joseph they can still get married.** *Angel & Joseph*

Group 2- 3-6 people

4. **A Roman Soldier tells Mary & Joseph there's going to be a census and they need to travel to Bethlehem.** *Mary, Joseph & Soldier*
5. **Mary and Joseph travel a long way to Bethlehem.** *Mary, Joseph & donkey*
6. **Joseph can't find anywhere to stay.** *Joseph & innkeepers*
7. **An innkeeper offers a stable that Mary & Joseph can use.** *Joseph, Mary & Innkeeper*

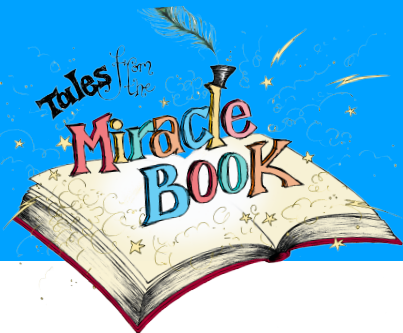

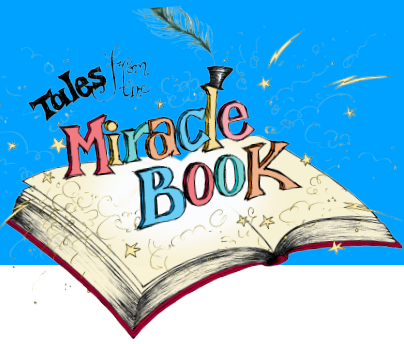
Easy Nativity Play Drama Freeze Frames

Have all the children sitting facing a 'performing space' then ask for volunteers to come up and 'act' out the story by making frozen pictures (completely frozen with no movement like a photograph has been taken).

You can do each of the 10 freeze frame pictures once through asking for volunteers to come up and join in each picture. (You can even ask the 'character' how they might have felt at each point in the story). If you do it a second time pupils can almost 'perform' it and you have your own little play. You can always record this to show to parents and even add a Christmas song like 'Silent Night' into the final picture.

1. The angel tells Mary that she will give birth to a baby and he will be God's son.
2. Mary tells Joseph that an angel has told her she will have a baby and he will be God's son
3. Mary and Joseph travel to Bethlehem.
4. Joseph and Mary can't find a hotel but are offered a stable instead.

6. The Baby is born in a stable amongst animals.
7. Angels appear to some shepherds telling them that a Saviour has been born.
8. The Shepherds visit the new little child.
