Then God said, "Let there be lights in the sky to separate day from night. These lights will be used for signs, seasons, days and years. They will be in the sky to give light to the earth." And it happened. So God made the two large lights. He made the brighter light to rule the day. He made the smaller light to rule the night. He also made the stars. God put all these in the sky to shine on the earth. They are to rule over the day and over the night. He put them there to separate the light from the darkness. God saw that all these things were good. Evening passed, and morning came. This was the fourth day.

Y 6: The Animals

Below are some names of a wide variety of animals. Sort the animals into the right category. Use the definitions below to help you.

Mammals: A mammal is a warm-blooded animal that breathes air and has a backbone. All female mammals have glands that can produce milk. Mammals are among the most intelligent of all living creatures.

Birds: Birds are warm-blooded, egg-laying animals distinguished by the possession of feathers, wings, a beak, and typically by being able to fly.

Amphibians: Most amphibians have time on land and in water. Their skin must stay moist to absorb oxygen. They lay jellylike see-through eggs.

Reptiles: Like amphibians they spend time in water and on land. They are cold-blooded and have a backbone. They breathe air. They have scales or bony plates and their skin is dry. They can either hiss, grunt or roar.

Fishes: Fish are cold-blooded animals with backbones with gills and fins living wholly in water.

Insects: Insects are small animals with no back-bone that has six legs and generally one or two pairs of wings



Drama Activities CREATION TABLEAUX

You'll need a bit of space for these drama activities!

Divide the class into six or seven groups of about 4-5. Secretly give each group one of the days of creation so the other groups don't overhear.

Each group needs to come up with a still or frozen picture tableaux using their bodies to demonstrate their day. Make sure no-one moves or makes a sound- they must be completely frozen. See if the other groups can guess the day simply by their frozen picture.

- DAY 1- Let there be LIGHT
- Day 2- The creation of WATER
- Day 3- The creation of LAND, PLANTS, TREES & FLOWERS
- Day 4- The creation of the HEAVENLY OBJECTS (the sun, moon and stars)
- Day 5- The Creation of the BIRDS & FISH
- Day 6- The creation of ANIMALS & HUMANS
- Day 7- A day of rest!

After the days have been shown to the class ask each group to go back and add sound effects. This time they can add a little bit of movement to help convey which day they're showing. Once again, show them to the whole class.

CREATION ADVERT

In groups of 4-5 give groups time to imagine a brand new world that they might create. What's in it? What makes it amazing? Why would people want to go there? Ask each group to create a TV advert top try to persuade people to go on holiday there.







DAY 7: The Sabbath

And on the seventh day, God rested...

Many Christians believe that the seventh day of creation is very important. In fact there's lots written about it in Christians holy book, the Bible. The rest day was traditionally called the Sabbath. In fact, it's so important in the Bible, that to honour the Sabbath is actually the fourth commandment out of ten. (We'll find out more about these commandments in our next series).



There are two words for rest in Hebrew (the original language that the Bible was written in). The first (Shabbat or Sabbath) means to stop working. The second (Nuakh) means to dwell or be present. This second type of rest is like sitting in front of a fire with a loved one. It's about being restfully present.

Many Christians believe that God wants everyone to rest because not only is it good for us, our minds and bodies, but also that God wants us to connect with God himself on that day. Christians, just like people of other faiths, often meet together and worship God together on this day.

Discuss:

Why do **you** think that rest is important? How do you like to rest? What sort of things help you feel refreshed? (Think about what kind of things you like to do on your holidays). Remember rest can be different things for different people...

Trouble...

'God looked at everything he had made, and it was very good.' (Genesis 1:31)

When God first made the world and the Garden of Eden everything was perfect. Unfortunately, it didn't stay that way. Things went wrong, and trouble came into the world. Have you ever watched the news? Unfortunately as well as lots of wonderful things, there's often lots of difficult things in our world now.

In the story one of the angels, called Lucifer, tries to spoil God's plans...

Faith Link...

So... is the Creation story true?

Well, many people have different ideas about that - even within the Christian faith. Did it happen exactly like it says in the Bible? Was it all through evolution? Or was it some of sort of mixture of both? We're not sure, (we weren't there at the time!). Some Christians think that God created the world in exactly 6 days of our earth-time, whereas some Christians believe that the 6 days could be periods of time. Whichever it was, splitting the account into 6 days is certainly a helpful way for us to understand the order in which God created it.

Although we may not know exactly **how** things happened, Christianity helps answer **why** things happened.

Whatever you think did happen, Christians believe that the creation story tells us an awful lot about the Creator, about the nature of God...

Firstly, it teaches that God is very powerful. It takes a lot to create the world!!! It also teaches us that God is both very creative & very imaginative. It tells us that the whole universe & all the things within it were God's great big idea... and that God looked at each thing he made and called it good.

The story of creation also teaches us that God rested. Later in the Bible, one of the 10 commandments (Gods rules for living well), is about keeping a day to rest and that rest is really important for us to feel refreshed.



But also at the beginning, there is the seed of how everything began to go wrong...

Even though the Bible teaches that the world was designed to be a wonderful place, anyone who has heard the news will see that unfortunately this is not always the case. The creation story teaches us that we need to take care of our world. We were put in charge and therefore we need to look after it wisely.






Good news - you're not a robot! You have a mind of your own and you can make your own choices. We sometimes call this 'free will'.

Sometimes we will make good choices...


And sometimes we will make bad choices...

But the point is that they will be your own choices - and no-one else's.









PEER PRESSURE GAME

Ask for a volunteer to sit in a chair in the middle at the front. Then ask for several more volunteers - 6 is a good number - and stand them either side of the seated volunteer. (It's a good idea to not put them too close to the seated one as the game tends to get rather noisy!)

The job of the seated volunteer is to sit in the chair and the job of the standing volunteers is to get the seated one out of their chair - but with their words only! (They are not allowed to make physical contact in any way whatsoever with the person in the chair)

Give them 30 seconds and tell them they can say anything they want (within reason!)

They can ask, they can persuade, they can promise, they can say anything they want! (They can promise a bag of sweets... they can say there's an alien in the playground...)

Encourage the rest of the class to join in with suggestions.

After 30 seconds, the seated volunteer is generally still in their chair...

Explain that even though the standing volunteers had tried to persuade them in many different ways - they couldn't <u>make</u> the seated one do anything...

It was their own personal choice to leave the chair or not.








You'll need a bit of space for this drama activity!



Each group needs to come up with a still or frozen picture tableaux using their bodies to demonstrate their part of the Adam & Eve story. Make sure no-one moves or makes a sound... they must be completely frozen!



The 11 possible pictures are listed on the next page ready to cut out for pupils - or make up your own...



Challenge!

Add Sound Effects. After the days have been shown to the class ask each group to go back and add sound effects for example of Picture 7 Eve could say "mmmmmm" to convey her delight in the apple and the snake could hiss in triumph.

Further Challenge!

Add Emotion words. Each character can choose an emotion word or a word to describe how they're feeling. For example on picture 8 Eve could show the apple saying "satisfied" or "tasty" or "try" and Adam could say "shocked" or "confused" or "hungry!"

TIP. If you turn this into a performance or an assembly presentation, you could keep all the animals and trees in the background to create the sense of the garden throughout.

Made In God's Image

"I will call him Adam and I will give him mind of his own"

"But God, isn't that dangerous?"

"Maybe, but he has to be free to choose and do whatever he wants"

The Bible says that God made us in His image.

Does that mean God has 2 arms, 2 legs and a head? We can only guess about that! But it does mean that we have a lot of the same qualities as him on the inside...

Many Christians believe that through Bible stories we can find out lots about Gods character: who He is on the inside or what He's like. For example, from the story of Creation we can understand that God is creative. We also can find out that His creation brought Him delight.

Through the story of Adam and Eve Christians understand that God is relational (wanting friendship with us): that He's friendly. From the story Christians also understand that He loves people enough to let us make our own decisions - even if we make decisions that get us (or others) hurt. He created us to choose and not to be a robot! That means He respects us and our decisions. We could also understand from the story that He is just and fair - because Adam and Eve had to leave the garden because of their poor choice.

Faith Link Friends With God p.1

The Christian story of Creation teaches us that God thought that we as people were the most special thing that He created. It teaches Christians that He wants to be connected to us. Just like He walked in person with Adam and Eve in the garden He wants to walk with us today. So what does that mean? How can Christians walk with God today?



Many Christians believe that it's about having a connection- or a friendship -with God. Here are a few ways that Christians can feel close to God...

Praying (or talking to God). There are many different ways that

Christians do this. Some people talk from their heart to God in private (like a friend), some people pray in groups aloud together or follow a set prayer like **The Lords' Prayer** (see next page) that Jesus taught people to pray. Pray can cover many things and it's sometimes useful to remember the word **ACTS**



A is for Adoration. Praising God for being Lord over all and for who He is and for what He's like.

is for Confession. Confession is telling God the things that you've done that you're not proud of and asking God for His forgiveness. Also forgiving others who may have hurt you.

I is for Thanksgiving. Thanking God for all the good things in your life and in the world around you.

S is for supplication (which means asking). Asking God to meet your needs and the needs of others. Sometimes Christians pray for a situation in their own life, or for a friend, for someone who is poorly or pray for something difficult going on in the world.





Faith Link Friends With God p.2

Going to Church

Many Christians feel closer to God by meeting together. Some people like to go to a beautiful old building and some people hold church in a school or even their house! The Bible says to Christians (in the book of Hebrews 10:25) 'you should meet together and encourage each other.'

At church people often sing songs of worship to God, hear the Bible and some teaching, pray together and spend time together.



Reading the Bible can be very important to many Christians. This is because Christians believe it to be the word of God and full of truth and wisdom. The Bible is a collection of 66 different books and includes stories, poems, letters, sayings and songs.

Sharing stories or experiences

Sharing stories or experiences often helps Christians be closer to God. These can be called 'testimonies' and these experiences are sometimes shared to encourage each other.



ASK!

Do you know any Christian people to ask about their experience? Are you a Christian? Perhaps, if you are you, can tell others how and when you feel close to God. What do you do? How does it help you to feel close to God. If there are people of different faiths in your class you could ask them how they connect with God and what they do.





CREATION







In the Creation story, God decides to give Adam and Eve a mind of their own: the freedom to choose. Lucifer, disguised as a snake, was very cunning. He asked Eve "Did God really say....?"

Lucifer couldn't <u>make</u> Adam and Eve break the rules... he couldn't force them but he could <u>persuade</u> them to... He could lie and trick them and tell them that they misunderstood. He could tell them that rules weren't fair and that it wouldn't matter if they did break Gods one and only rule. But he was wrong. He wasn't telling the truth.

Lucifer may have lied to them but it was Adam and Eve's <u>own choice</u> to break the rules. And so they were the ones who had to pay the price...

The story of Adam and Eve doesn't have a happy ending... it ends with sin (or wrong-doing) coming into the world and Adam & Eve having to leave Eden. In Christianity, this beginning of sin is sometimes called 'the fall' because Adam and Eve fell from perfection and things began to go wrong...



The Bible teaches that, just like Adam and Eve sinned (or did wrong), that <u>we all</u> do wrong. Do you remember that God warned Adam and Eve what would happen if they ate the fruit?

But this sad ending of the creation story is not the end of the big story of Christianity. God was so sad about not having friendship like he used to with people in the Garden of Eden, that he began planning a rescue mission to make things right again.

He would do this by finding someone to take all the sin away by dying on earth in our place, for our wrong-doing. This rescue had to be done by someone who would be prepared to freely choose to pay the price for each and every one of us. He sent his very own son, Jesus.


For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish (die) but have eternal life.





Faith Link The Fall & The Cross p.2

Christians believe that Jesus lived on earth thousands of years after Adam and Eve. His mother was Mary and you may even celebrate his birth without knowing it - as it's the festival of Christmas. The Bible says that Jesus taught amazing things about how to love God and how to love others, he performed many miracles and had a huge amount of followers. Christianity teaches that Jesus was crucified on a wooden cross and died, but that he came back to life three days later, beating death forever.
