
ABOUT ANTON ARMSTRONG

Dr. Anton Armstrong is a renowned conductor and music educator, marking his 34th year as Conductor of the St. Olaf Choir. He holds the esteemed position of Tosdal Professor of Music at St. Olaf College and has led the choir since 1990. Dr. Armstrong is widely recognized for his editorial work on multicultural choral series and his founding role in the Oregon Bach Festival Stangeland Family Youth Choral Academy.

Throughout his illustrious career, Dr. Armstrong has conducted ensembles and addressed audiences at regional, national, and international gatherings. He has collaborated with notable artists, including Bobby McFerrin and Garrison Keillor. Dr. Armstrong's exceptional contributions to music education have earned him numerous awards and accolades, including the Robert Foster Cherry Award for Great Teaching and the Distinguished Alumni Award from Michigan State University.

Dr. Armstrong continues to inspire and educate through his work with the St. Olaf Choir and various choral festivals and clinics. He has received the Distinguished Legacy Award from the University of Illinois and the title of Honorary Life Member of the National Collegiate Choral Organization.
