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Hello, everyone! Welcome back to the Blogger Breakthrough Podcast. In today's episode, we're going to dig into five FREE tools that can help you save some time. All right, so the first tool I want to talk about is Google Slides. And I'm sure you're thinking, "How on earth can Google Slides save me time?" And I have three words for you - search and replace.

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Set up some graphic templates like pin templates, Instagram, whatever it is you're doing, in Google slides. This is, like I said, particularly useful for Pinterest graphics where you want to create more than one Pin per post. And then when you have a new post to create Pins for you just have to search and replace the old title with the new one. So you're not having to like, copy and paste into three different ones. You just search and replace and you can have three or five or 10 or however many pins you're trying to create.

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Done. Swap out some background images and you've created multiple Pins, you only have to copy and paste once, like I said. So, it can be a time saver, especially if Pinterest is kind of one of your marketing channels. All right, the second tool I want to let you in on, I honestly don't know how I used to live without it. It's called CopyClip and it's an app for Mac users, though, I believe it's also available for PCs. And what it does is it stores the things you've copied, like the last 40 things. So I find it especially helpful if I'm like scheduling in Tailwind or some sort of social media scheduling, because a lot of times, especially in Tailwind, I've got multiple Pins and the URL the same and the descriptions the same, you know? And so I'm not having to copy and paste or go back and forth for several different Pins.

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I can just go, you know, instead of switching between tabs, I can just go to my CopyClip, click down there, grab what I need, and put it into what I'm working on. So, it's called CopyClip. It's free. I love it. Don't know how I lived without it. All right. The third tool today I want to share with you is LunaPic and it's an online imaging tool. I'll be honest, it does a lot, but I really only use it for removing backgrounds, so I no longer have to pay for a Canva Pro account.

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So if money is tight, cancel Canva Pro, just use LunaPic. It makes it easy and free to get a transparent background. I actually have a video that shows you how to use it and I'll link to it in the show notes so you can kind of see it's really not that complicated. It is a little bit different from Canva, right. So what I would do is, I'd download something, like if you have a product mockup or something you made in Canva, just download it. You know, under the free plan you don't have a transparent background. Load it up into LunaPic, get rid of the background, then you have a transparent background and bada bing, bada boom. All right. The fourth tool you should 100% know about is Attract.io. It's perfect for helping you create beautiful lead magnets, fast. And just a reminder, all these tools are free. So while they are some limitations to it, I consider not having to mess around with a bunch of things to be a pro.

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It's from the company Growth Tools. Again, it's called Attract.io, and they actually have several pretty awesome free tools that you might wanna consider checking out. But with Attract.io, you simply pick your lead magnet type and they have four different kinds. You can do a checklist, a how-to, a case study, or a resource guide. Then you just like select your brand colors and fonts or whatever's closest, and then finally, you just add your content to the templates and you can add or take away pages as you need.

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It also then gives you a link that you can share so you don't have to worry about uploading it to your website. So when someone signs up to your freebie, you know, you can just send them this link as opposed to having it take up storage on your website. So Attract.io, it's awesome. All right. And then finally, the last tool I want to tell you about is RescueTime. They have a paid version, but there's a free

version that I used for a really, really long time.

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I actually just went back to it because really I didn't need the paid time anymore. I kind of got the use of the paid version, but I'm back on the free version. And what it does is it'll monitor your computer to see how much time you're spending on various sites. The benefit of this is that you're not only seeing how productive you are, but you can actually get a handle on how long it takes you to do things, because you may think it only takes you five minutes to do something when in reality it takes you 15 to 20.

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And that extra time that you miscalculate can really mess with your schedule and your plans of when you want to get things done by. So by using RescueTime, you can have actual good time estimates on tasks and start making, you know, planning your work time more efficiently and realistically. So that's it! Those are the five tools I wanted to share with you to help you save time. I hope you find them useful.
