A simplified script for Key Stage 1

For those working with younger children. It's exactly the same story - just trimmed down to make it less wordy.

There's a **Cast List** for every scene to help you with the organisational side.

There's a **Production Plan** to help see at-a-glance where extra songs, crowd scenes etc fit in if you wish to use them and a props list.

Some Notes

How to use the script

We hope that this play is a huge amount of fun for your pupils and your audience. It's a very fun and thought-provoking take on the nativity which hopefully brings this amazing story to life in a new way! You can either use the scripts to put on a full nativity play with either Key Stage or simply use excerpts. If you are a church school, you may want to use excerpts as part of a worship service interspersed with Bible readings or Carols.

Casting

There's a limited number of characters in the story. And normally a much larger number of children wanting to play them. So, this is a suggestion for a way to get around that problem...

For many years we ran ran summer holiday clubs, which would involve up to 100 children learning & putting on a show over the course of just a few days. To make things as fair as possible - and to try and make sure no-one was overwhelmed with line-learning - it became our tradition to split the main roles. This would mean a different person playing the main characters from scene to scene.

To do this, we had a simple, but distinct piece of costume for each main character that was then passed along to the next performer at the start/end of a scene. The concept was explained to the audience at the start of the show, and it made for a very effective - and easy to follow - way of making sure that as many children as possible had a turn at the speaking parts.

Songs & Musical Links

I've included some suggestion for traditional song/carols to be sung at different points during the performance.

You can use these as Carols sung by the audience or just as background music to cover each scene change. If you use background tracks have it so that you can fade in/out at the beginning and end of each scene. It serves both as a handy cue for the children to move, and help to cover the kerfuffle of people moving on & off the stage.

Extra Scenes

There are a couple of opportunities for additional 'crowd' or acting scenes within the script...

The Wedding

The first additional acting scene/routine is when Mary & Joseph are married

Everyone could cheer when they're married and come on stage.

For the wedding, I suggest playing some party music. The start of the music playing could also be the cue for everyone to get into their positions on stage.

Break the class down into groups of 4 or 5 children. Give each group a different role...

Dancing

Sitting at tables

Chatting in groups

Mary could even throw the bouquet if you choose to have one.

The Shepherds

Depending on how much space you have, you could use a group of children to play the sheep. The only thing is to make sure they don't wander about too much or make too many sheep noises that may disturb the script delivery! You could also use another group to make up the choir of angels when they appear.

Key Stage 2 Script

Scene 1 - Mary & Gabriel



THE NARRATORS STAND AT ONE CORNER, NEAR THE FRONT OF THE STAGE.

NARRATOR 1: Our story begins long, long ago...

NARRATOR 2: And far, far away...

NARRATOR 3: In a land called Israel...

NARRATOR 1: Where there lived a young girl called Mary.

MARY WALKS ON STAGE HUMMING

(maybe she has some flowers in her hands to decide for the

wedding)

NARRATOR 3: Mary was engaged to Joseph, and they were due to be

married very soon....

MARY: I can't wait for this wedding!

I've ordered the cake, sent out the invitations.... Now should

we have red flowers or blue? Red, I think.

NARRATOR 2: But, one day, something rather unusual happened...

GABRIEL APPEARS OPPOSITE MARY

GABRIEL: Mary!

MARY JUMPS

MARY: Ahhh! Who are you?

GABRIEL: My name is Gabriel. I am an angel of the Lord.

MARY: Wow.

GABRIEL: I have a special message for you from God himself.

MARY: I should have chosen the blue flowers.

GABRIEL: No.

MARY: Yellow?

GABRIEL: I'm not here about the flowers.

God has something important to say to you.

HE TAKES OUT A SCROLL

GABRIEL: The Lord says:

[Reading the scroll] 'Always wear a clean pair of

underpants.'

[To Mary] Oh, sorry, wrong scroll.

HE TAKES OUT ANOTHER SCROLL

[Reading the scroll] 'Don't pick your nose and eat it.'

[To Mary] No, no, no.

AND ANOTHER SCROLL

[Reading the scroll] 'Greetings, you who are highly

favoured!'

[To Mary] Ah, that's better.

God has chosen you for a very special task.

MARY: Me? What sort of task?

GABRIEL: You are going to have a baby.

MARY: A baby?

GABRIEL: Thought that might be a bit of a surprise.

MARY: But.. but...

I'm supposed to be organising a wedding.

What will Joseph say?

GABRIEL: [Checking the scroll] Doesn't mention that.

Now listen, you are going to have a baby boy and you are to

give him the name 'Jesus.'

MARY: Jesus...

GABRIEL: Yes. He will be the Son of God and will grow up to save the

world from all its troubles - not just for now, but for the rest

of time.

MARY: My baby... will be God's baby?

But, how can this happen? I mean...how?

GABRIEL: That's not for you to worry about. Put it this way: God made

the whole universe - so one baby shouldn't be too difficult.

MARY: I don't know what to say.

GABRIEL: God was rather hoping that you'd say: 'yes.'

MARY: If God needs me then of course..... yes!

GABRIEL: Yes!

GABRIEL GOES

MARY: I'm just not sure how Joseph's going to take it...

MUSIC SUGGESTION:

'HARK THE HERALD ANGEL SING'

Scene 2 - Joseph

NARRATOR 4: Now Joseph was a carpenter and a decent sort of chap...

JOSEPH IS WORKING AWAY AT HIS CARPENTRY.

DONKEY IS NEARBY EATING A CARROT

JOSEPH: You know, donkey: I can't wait to get married - it's going to

be sooo good!

Trouble is, I've got so much work to do beforehand, I don't know if I'll ever be ready. I just wish I could make this list of

jobs disappear.

DONKEY: Now there I can help you.

DONKEY GRABS JOSEPH'S LIST OF JOBS WITH HIS

MOUTH AND STARTS CHEWING

JOSEPH: I didn't mean literally disappear!

JOSEPH & DONKEY HAVE A TUG-OF-WAR OVER THE

LIST.

THEY ARE INTERRUPTED BY THE ARRIVAL OF MARY

MARY: Hello Joseph.

JOSEPH & DONKEY STOP THEIR STRUGGLE

EMBARRASSED

JOSEPH: Mary...

MARY: Joseph, I've got something really important to tell you.

JOSEPH: You want to cancel the wedding?

MARY: No.

JOSEPH RACKS HIS BRAIN

JOSEPH: A camel sat on the wedding cake?

MARY: No...

JOSEPH: (Over-dramatic) The world's going to end in three days?

MARY: No!

JOSEPH: Oh. What then?

MARY: I'm going to have a baby.

JOSEPH: Ahh! What?!

MARY: I'm going to have a baby.

JOSEPH: What?!

DONKEY She's going to have a baby!

JOSEPH: What?!

But, but, but... how?!

MARY: An angel came and told me. It's going to be God's Son.

JOSEPH & DONKEY BURST OUT LAUGHING

JOSEPH: Oh, you really had us going then!

DONKEY: Good one!

MARY: No, it's the truth.

THEY STOP LAUGHING

JOSEPH: Really?

MARY: Yes.

JOSEPH: Oh...

JOSEPH FEINTS

DONKEY: Well that went well...

MUSIC SUGGESTION:

The Cherry Tree Carol/ Bleak MidWinter

Scene 3 - Joseph & Gabriel

NARRATOR 5: So Mary began to get ready for the arrival of the baby...

But poor old Joseph was left feeling rather confused...

JOSEPH SITS ALONE IN HIS HOUSE.

JOSEPH: I don't know...

All this talk about angels and babies and God coming to visit

us in person. I wish Mary would tell me the truth rather

than making up this fairy story.

I think it's best if we just cancel the wedding and break up

quietly.

Angels indeed...

I wouldn't believe in angels if one walked through my front

door right now!

GABRIEL APPEARS

GABRIEL: Joseph.

JOSEPH: Argh! (HE SCREAMS!)

GABRIEL: It's alright, it's alright - do not be afraid.

JOSEPH: That's easy for you to say.

GABRIEL: Now listen to me, Joseph of Nazareth, the Lord God

Almighty himself has got a message for you.

JOSEPH: For me?

GABRIEL: For you. Now pay attention.

HE TAKES OUT A SCROLL

The Lord says:

[Reading the scroll] ' Never eat yellow snow.'

[To Joseph] Oops, wrong scroll again.

HE TAKES OUT ANOTHER SCROLL

Ah, that's better...

[Reading the scroll] 'Don't be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is happening is from God.'

JOSEPH: So it is true?

GABRIEL: Of course it is. Who would make up a story like that?

Now you need to help Mary take care of that little baby - the

whole universe depends on it.

JOSEPH: The whole universe? Depends on me?

GABRIEL: No pressure.

JOSEPH: But... I'm no-one.

GABRIEL: Don't be silly: everybody is somebody. That's why God

chose you.

JOSEPH: Really?

GABRIEL: Trust me, I'm an angel.

EXIT GABRIEL

JOSEPH: So it's true!

Mary was telling the truth... and that means... we can still

get married! Hooray!

NARRATOR 6: And so there was a wedding!

MUSIC SUGGESTION:

Barn dance music / Or the Macarena!

Scene 4 - The Census

MARY & JOSEPH ARE AT HOME. WASHING IS ON A CLOTHES AIRER OR IN A WASHING BASKET.

JOSEPH: Don't worry, Mary, you and I are going to look after this little

one. From now on, everything's going to be fine. What could

possibly go wrong?

THERE IS A HAMMERING AT THE DOOR

Excuse me - must have been the cake.

HAMMERING AGAIN

There we go again.

MARY: There's someone at the door.

JOSEPH: How do you know?

FELIX: [Off-stage] Open up in the name of the Emperor of Rome!

JOSEPH: So there is.

JOSEPH OPENS THE DOOR.

FELIX THE CENTURION WALKS IN

VIOLENT SNEEZE.

FELIX: Ladies and gentlemen, can I have your attention please?

JOSEPH: No, get your own.

MARY: Shush.

SNEEZE

FELIX: I am a soldier of the official Roman army, and I am -

SNEEZE

JOSEPH: A what?

MARY: Bless you.

FELIX: I am bearing an official declaration from his highness the

Emperor Caesar Augustus - the greatest ruler in history.

JOSEPH: So far.

FELIX: What was that?

JOSEPH: Nothing.

COUPLE OF VIOLENT SNEEZES - EVERYONE DUCKS

FOR COVER

MARY: Are you alright?

FELIX: I think it's this rotten country - I must be allergic to it. I wish I

was back home.

FELIX: I am here to tell you that the Emperor has declared

that a census be taken of the entire Roman world.

JOSEPH: A what?

FELIX: A census.

It means you have to count all the people to see how many

there are.

JOSEPH: There's only one of me.

FELIX: Quite.

JOSEPH: I suppose technically there are two of her.

MARY: He means it's like a giant register.

FELIX: That's right.

BIG BUILD UP TO A SNEEZE

MARY: Bless you.

FELIX: There's one more thing: in order to be counted, everyone

has to return to their original home town.

JOSEPH: But I was born in Bethlehem - that's miles and miles away

from here. He's taken leave of his census.

FELIX: I don't make up the rules.

JOSEPH: Do we have a choice?

FELIX: Yes: go to Bethlehem... or be thrown into prison for the rest

of your miserable little lives!

JOSEPH: Can I think about it?

MARY: We'll go.

FELIX GOES FOR A FINAL MASSIVE SNEEZE - USES PANTS ON AIRER/ BASKET AS A HANKIE - SEES WHAT

THEY ARE - THROWS THEM AT JOSEPH

MARY: We'll do as we're told.

FELIX: Good. I knew you'd come to your... census!

FELIX EXITS LAUGHING AT HIS JOKE AND SNEEZING.

MARY & JOE STARE AFTER HIM

JOSEPH: What are we going to do? We can't travel to Bethlehem - not

with the baby due to be born so soon. This is terrible.

MARY: I know.

JOSEPH: There must be some sort of mistake...

MARY: God never makes mistakes.

We just have to trust him.

JOSEPH: I suppose.

Oh well, looks like we've got a journey to go on.

NARRATOR 7: So Mary and Joseph had packed their bags....

And set out on the long journey to the town of Bethlehem...

MUSIC SUGGESTION:

'LITTLE DONKEY' or 'O LITTLE TOWN OF

BETHLEHEM'

Scene 5 - The Three Wise Men

NARRATOR 8: Meanwhile...

NARRATOR 9: Far away, in another land, way out in the East...

NARRATOR 10: Another story was beginning to unfold...

JEREMIAH & MICAH SITS AT THE CENTRE OF THE

STAGE, STARING UP INTO THE NIGHT SKY

NARRATOR 8: On a starry, starry night...

NARRATOR 9: Underneath the heavens...

NARRATOR 10: Sat a group of wise old men...

MICAH: I spy with my little eye, something beginning with 's'.

JEREMIAH: Star?

MICAH: (SURPRISED!) Yes! Your turn!

JEREMIAH: I spy with my little eye, something beginning with... 's'.

MICAH: Sock?

JEREMIAH: No...

MICAH: Sausage?

JEREMIAH: No...

MICAH: ...star?

JEREMIAH: Well done.

MICAH: I spy with my little -

JEREMIAH: - star.

MICAH: I haven't even asked the question yet.

JEREMIAH: It's always 'star'. What else do you expect to see in the night

sky?

MICAH: Sausages?

JEREMIAH: No!

Stars, stars and nothing but... stars.

Just for once I wish that something exciting would happen

around here.

ZEB ENTERS, CARRYING A LARGE BOOK

ZEB: I've got it!

MICAH & JEREMIAH GATHER AROUND HIM

MICAH: What is it?

JEREMIAH: It's a book, silly.

ZEB: No, no, this is no ordinary book - this is a book of prophecy.

MICAH: What?

JEREMIAH: Talking about things that are going to happen in the future.

MICAH: Ooh! So what does it say?

Does it tell me what I'm going to get for my birthday?

Or the result of next weeks football match?

ZEB: No. The book speaks about a baby who is to be born in a

land far away who will grow up to be the greatest king ever.

JEREMIAH: A king?

MICAH: Greater than king Herod?

JEREMIAH: Greater that the Roman Emperor?

ZEB: The greatest ever! His kingdom will have no end.

Listen: [READS] 'He will be called Wonderful Counsellor,

Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.'

MICAH: That's rather a lot of names for a baby.

JEREMIAH: Couldn't they think of something simpler?

MICAH: How about 'Bob'?

ZEB: Listen: this baby will be the one to bring peace and joy to

the world.

I have done all my calculations, computations and... other sums, and I can tell you that this king is due to be born...

any day now!

MICAH: [Looking around] Where?

JEREMIAH: Just think: all these years we have been watching the stars,

searching for an answer - and here it is!

MICAH: [Still searching] Where?!

ZEB: Well, I don't know exactly...

We must look for a sign!

MICAH: A sausage?

JEREMIAH: No.

ZEB AND JEREMIAH HUDDLE OVER THE BOOK

MICAH WANDERS A BIT FURTHER AWAY AND STARES

UP INTO THE NIGHT SKY

MICAH: Hey... I can see a star.

JEREMIAH: Big deal.

MICAH: No, no - a new one.

JEREMIAH: What?

ZEB: Where?

MICAH: [Pointing] There!

THEY RUSH OVER TO HIM, AND ALL THREE STARE UP

INTO THE SKY

ZEB: A new star...

MICAH: It wasn't there before.

JEREMIAH: That's what 'new' generally means.

ZEB: It's so huge and bright - it must be the sign!

MICAH: Of what?

ZEB: Of where we will find the king.

We must follow that star! Come on!

ZEB LEADS THEM & THEY ALL RACE OFF-STAGE

MUSIC SUGGESTION:

'WE THREE KINGS OF ORIENT ARE'

Scene 6 - The Road to Bethlehem

NARRATOR 11: Meanwhile...

NARRATOR 12: Far away, on another road...

NARRATOR 13: Two and a half weary travellers were about to arrive in the

town of Bethlehem.

MARY, JOSEPH & DONKEY PLOD SLOWLY ONTO

STAGE. WHEN THEY GET TO THE MIDDLE, THEY STOP

TO REST

NARRATOR 11: They had ridden for many miles...

NARRATOR 12: Over hills...

NARRATOR 13: And fields...

NARRATOR 11: And sometimes along roads.

NARRATOR 12: And they had very sore feet.

DONKEY: Are we nearly there yet?

MARY: Not far now, donkey.

JOSEPH: I tell you, it's around here somewhere.

MARY: We <u>have</u> been travelling for three days, Joseph.

DONKEY: He's lost.

JOSEPH: I am not lost!

Anyway, we'd have been there a lot guicker if someone

hadn't eaten the map.

DONKEY: I was hungry.

JOSEPH & DONKEY ARE ABOUT TO ARGUE, BUT MARY

SUDDENLY PUTS HER HANDS TO HER STOMACH

MARY: Oh!

JOSEPH: What is it?

MARY: I do hope we arrive before this baby does.

JOSEPH: Don't worry, Mary, I'll take care of everything. When we get

to Bethlehem, we'll find a nice hotel with room service and

all the comforts of home.

MARY: Promise?

JOSEPH: I promise.

JOSEPH SUDDENLY SPOTS THE TOWN IN THE

DISTANCE

Wait, look! There!

THEY ALL LOOK WHERE HE IS POINTING

DONKEY: Where?

MARY: Bethlehem...

JOSEPH: The town where I was born.

I told you I knew where I was going!

Come on, everything's going to be alright now.

THEY SET OFF TOWARDS IT (OFF-STAGE)

MUSIC SUGGESTION:

'O LITTLE TOWN OF BETHLEHEM'

Scene 7 - No Room At The Inn

NARRATOR 14: And so Mary and Joseph arrived in the little town of

Bethlehem...

JOSEPH: [Off-stage] You wait there, Mary! I'll find us somewhere to

stay.

JOSEPH STEPS ONTO STAGE

I know, I'll try one of these inns.

HE GOES UP TO DOOR#1

INNKEEPER#1: Yes?

JOSEPH: Excuse me, I'm looking for a room for the night.

INNKEEPER#1: Sorry, we're full.

JOSEPH: Oh, thanks anyway.

HE STEPS AWAY FROM THE DOOR

Oh well, plenty more places to try...

HE LOOKS AROUND & MARCHES UP TO DOOR #2

JOSEPH: Excuse me, I'm looking for a room for the night.

INNKEEPER#2: Eh?

JOSEPH: A room for the night.

INNKEEPER#2: A broom for your bike?

JOSEPH: Not bike - night.

INNKEEPER#2: Eh?

JOSEPH: Night. Night.

INNKEEPER#2: 'Night 'night to you too.

JOSEPH: No! I need a room.

INNKEEPER#2: Oh, you should have said.

THEY PRODUCE A BROOM

JOSEPH: No - somewhere to stay.

INNKEEPER#2: Oh, I see.

Sorry, we're full.

THE DOOR IS SLAMMED.

JOSEPH: How unfriendly.

JOSEPH GOES TO DOOR #3

INNKEEPER#3: We're full!

JOSEPH: I haven't asked you anything yet.

INNKEEPER#3: Oh. What do you want?

JOSEPH: A room for the night.

INNKEEPER#3: Well, we're full. I told you.

JOSEPH: This is hopeless. What's going on?

INNKEEPER#3: The whole town's full. It's all the people who've come here

for the census.

THE DOOR IS SLAMMED.

JOSEPH SIGHS & GOES TO DOOR #4

JOSEPH: Look, do you have any rooms?

INNKEEPER#4: Yes, of course we do.

JOSEPH: Wonderful!

INNKEEPER#4: But they're all full. Try again next year.

JOSEPH: But wait - I'm having a baby!

INNKEEPER#4: Are you?

JOSEPH: Well, actually no, but -

INNKEEPER#4: So you're telling me a pack of lies?!

JOSEPH: No, no, it's not me who's having the baby.

INNKEEPER#4: But it's you that wants the room?

JOSEPH: Yes.

INNKEEPER#4: So you'd take a room and leave a poor baby out on the

streets?!

JOSEPH: No that's not what I meant.

INNKEEPER#4: What an awful young man.

THE DOOR IS SLAMMED.

JOSEPH GOES TO DOOR #5

INNKEEPER#5: Go away!

JOSEPH: Have you -

INNKEEPER#5: No!

THE DOOR IS SLAMMED.

JOSEPH: Oh...

JOSEPH IS LEFT ALL ALONE, DEJECTED.

I don't believe it.

Every single hotel in the city is full.

And now there's nowhere for Mary's baby to be born.

HE SITS DOWN

Oh no...

This is supposed to be one of the most amazing nights in

history...

And instead it's just turning into a big disaster.

And it's all my fault...

ENTER DONKEY

DONKEY: First sign of madness.

JOSEPH: What is?

DONKEY: Talking to yourself.

JOSEPH: What's the second sign?

DONKEY: Talking to a donkey......

Listen, don't be down. I've got an idea that might just help

us get out of this mess.

JOSEPH: Really? Thanks, donkey.

DONKEY: Come on I'll show you.

THEY GO OFF

MUSIC SUGGESTION:

REPEAT SAD MUSIC FROM 2ND SCENE CHANGE

Extra Scene (1) - The Wise Men & Herod

NARRATOR 15: Meanwhile...

While all that was going on...

NARRATOR 16: Far away, in another part of the country....

NARRATOR 15: The three wise men had arrived in the city of Jerusalem...

NARRATOR 16: At the palace of the mighty King Herod...

HEROD SITS ON HIS THRONE

FELIX, THE ROMAN SOLDIER STANDS ON GUARD

NEARBY

HEROD: Centurion! I'm bored!

Are there any more executions due today?

FELIX: I'm afraid you've already killed all the prisoners, my lord.

HEROD: Well, go out and catch some more. There's far too many

people here as it is what with the census going on and all.

FELIX: Yes, my lord.

FELIX GOES

HEROD: I love executions – the way their heads plop off as the axe

strikes and all the insides spurt out - wonderful!

FELIX RETURNS

What is it?

FELIX: Visitors, my lord.

HEROD: Show them in.

FELIX GOES OFF & BRINGS IN THE THREE WISE MEN

MICAH: Greetings, your majesty!

HEROD: Who are you?

JEREMIAH: We are three wise men who have travelled all the way from

the East to visit your palace.

HEROD: Have you brought presents?

ZEB: We have, my lord.

HEROD: Oh good, I like presents.

Stick them over there, I'll open them later.

MICAH: Erm... they're not actually for you, I'm afraid. They're for

someone else.

FELIX: What?

HEROD: Someone else?!

FELIX: You want me to arrange some more executions, my lord?

ZEB: Wait, we can explain!

HEROD: Go on, then.

MICAH: We have come to see the king, my lord.

HEROD: I am the king.

MICAH: Ah, no, no, not you - we meant the new one.

FELIX: What?

HEROD: The... new... one?

ZEB: Yes.

HEROD: A new king of this country?

JEREMIAH: Not just this country - the whole world, in fact.

HEROD: Really?

MICAH: Exciting, isn't it?

HEROD: Oh, that's one word for it. Excuse me a moment

HE GRABS FELIX & PULLS HIM TO ONE SIDE

[Whispering] Why don't we know anything about this king?

FELIX: [Whispering] I don't know, my lord.

HEROD: [Whispering] Well, find out!

FELIX GOES OFF

HEROD TURNS HIS ATTENTION BACK TO THE WISE

MEN

So you came here to the royal palace to see the king?

ZEB: May we?

HEROD: Slight snag. He's not actually here at the moment.

MICAH: Oh?

HEROD: Yes, had to pop out and... run some errands. King things.

Busy chap.

ZEB: Gosh, that seems an unusual thing for a baby to do.

HEROD: He's a baby? I mean - he's a baby!

JEREMIAH: Yes.

HEROD: Of course, and what an extraordinary baby he is. Especially

since he was only born...?

MICAH: Tonight.

HEROD: Tonight! Yes.

Where exactly was he born?

ZEB: You... don't... know?

PAUSE

HEROD: No.

Fact is, he's taken us a teensy bit by surprise.

I know - why don't you chaps help me?

You could go and look for him...

Pay your respects...

And when you have found him.... come back and tell me where he is - exactly where he is - so that I can go

and...

And see him too.

JEREMIAH: Okay, then – jolly good.
