

Jesus Words Script

What is the basis for your relationship with Jesus?

You're watching Timeless Talks, Timeless Subjects, Information for Life.

I don't know exactly what your relationship is with Jesus, but I do know this, that it must be founded on something, whatever your relationship is. It may be because you don't have any relationship with him, you don't know much about Jesus.

Maybe you're interested in knowing the story of Jesus. You may be basing your relationship with Jesus based upon an experience that you had, a sight that you have seen, something that someone told you. But Jesus tells us what that relationship should be based on, and that is where I want us to direct our attention today, to John 5:44. *"How can you believe when you receive glory from one another and do not seek the glory that comes from the only God? Do you think that I will accuse you to the Father? There is one who accuses you, Moses, on whom you have set your hope. For if you believe Moses, you would believe me, for he wrote of me. But if you do not believe his writings, how will you believe my words?"*

Jesus's words seem to be the thing he was pointing at. Even words that someone else had written about him is what he pointed toward.

We need to visit Hebrews 1:1-2. *"Long ago, at many times, and in many ways, God spoke to our fathers by the prophets. But in these last days, he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed the heir of all things, through whom also he created the world."*

Two facts you need to grasp from Hebrews chapter one. Number one, that God did things differently long ago, but he still spoke through the words of the prophets. Then he brings up this point of contrast. "But" is the word that he used. *"BUT in these last days, he has spoken to us by his Son."*

The fact that Jesus's own words are the things that to which we must be accountable. Jesus said in John 12:48, *"The one who rejects me and does not receive my words has a judge. The word that I have spoken will judge him on the last day."*

There are three things that he brings up in this passage. First of all, the words, the communication that has been made. Second of all, the words that I have spoken, his own words are the ones we need to be paying attention to. And thirdly, he says, it is those words that I have spoken that is going to be your instrument of judgment.

Every way that you have lived will be measured by God's word. This word, the word that Jesus spoke, the word that was transferred to us by his followers.

This is what we're told in 2 Timothy 3:16-17. "*All scripture is breathed out by God.*"

Now stop a moment. All scripture is breathed by God. All of the scripture, Old Testament, New Testament, they all fit together to reveal to us God and his son and their plans for us. He says, "*all scripture is breathed out by God and is profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work.*"

The scriptures do not leave us lacking anything that we can be complete with just the words that God gives us. I don't need a picture of a cloud formation. I don't need the strain of a religious experience.

I need this here and this here only. He said all scriptures were that and it's profitable. The scriptures will teach us and bring correction to our lives. It will train us in righteousness. The scriptures train us in righteousness and that is the whole point of Timeless Talks is to train each other in right living so we can have a good life now. And be already prepared for when we go to meet God. Oh, it's just so important to just open the Bible.
