Two teams with little else to play for make this a potentially full-blooded semi-final to savour tonight.

Given Tonbridge's long history in the Kent Senior Cup, it's perhaps surprising they have won it only twice – and that it's 50 years since their last triumph, despite reaching the final twice more since then.

THE OPPOSITION

The last time our two clubs met at this semi-final stage was our last match of the troubled 2012/13 season – a night that fans thought might even have been the club's farewell game such were the dire straits at the time. Tonbridge won that one 2-1 but went on to lose 7-1 to Charlton Athletic in the final.

The winners tonight, of course, will meet Welling United at Priestfield Stadium on April 2nd – and whoever does win, it will be the first time either of us have faced Welling in the final. It will also mean a newish name on the trophy given that we last won this competition in 2014, Welling in 2009 and Tonbridge as mentioned in 1975.

OTTAWAY

The Angels have very much established themselves in National South these days and were on the edges of the playoff zone for much of the season but have fallen off the pace a little through February.

Sean Shields is the only former Fleet face other than manager Jay Saunders who will no doubt want to sign off his Tonbridge career by guiding the visitors to their first triumph in the competition for half a century before he departs the club.



The former Gillingham and Fleet youth midfielder, who returned to Stonebridge Road in 2004 after a successful spell with Margate to rack up a total of 86 appearances in a red shirt, finished his playing career with Maidstone United. He then became Stones boss in 2011, winning three promotions with the club, most famously in 2016 when his side beat the Fleet here in a penalty shootout to rise to the National League. After his sacking in 2018, he spent three years at the Margate helm and, from May 2022, as manager of Tonbridge Angels. The club has announced he will leave at the end of the season.

UHAT YOU MIGHT NOT KNOU ... about onbridge

Until 1870, the town's name was spelt Tunbridge. This was changed to Tonbridge by the Post Office due to confusion with Tunbridge Wells, despite Tonbridge being a much older settlement.

BESIEGED

Tonbridge Castle was constructed in the 13th century ofter the original 11th century structure dating from the Norman Conquest and the town was burnt to the ground by William II, son of William the Conqueror.

FOMOUS LINKS

Some famous people with Tonbridge links include Dame Kelly Holmes; Sir Wolter Tirel who killed King William II with a misfired arrow: rock band Keane: novelist Frederick Forsuth: and Ruth Ellis, the last woman handed in England who was married at Tonbridge Registry Office.

FAST AND FURIOUS

The country's first speeding fine was

handed out in Tonbridge in 1896. The quilty driver was fined one shilling For speeding at 8 miles per hour in his Karl Benz car. He was apprehended by a policeman who had given chase on his bicycle.

ONGELS DELIGHT

Tonbridge are one of the few clubs to have taken their official name from their nicknome rather than the other wou around. Formed as Tonbridge FC in 1947, they were commonly known as 'The Angels' due to the nearby Angel Hotel and their Angel Ground named after the hotel. It wasn't until 1994 that 'Angels' was finally added to the official club title

SHIELD'S UP ...

The biggest crowd for a Fleet-Tonbridge match was the 4 500 who attended the 1952 Kent Senior Shield Final - it was Tonbridge's first silverware as they triumphed 3-1.

Jay Saunders isn't the only Tonbridge boss with Fleet links. Back in 1982, Fleet lured former goalkeeper Tony Burns away from his management job at Longmead to take the Stonebridge Road hotseat where he remained for a largely disappointing three years. A former Fleet player of the year - Colin Blewden - was signed From Tonbridge in 1988 and had two noteworthy spells in a red shirt. He later returned to Tonbridge as manager from 1997-2001. And two more promotion winners and Fleet skippers, namely Tommy Warrilow and Steve McKimm, both went on to manage Tonbridge and win promotion with them (in 2007-14 and 2014-22 respectively).









THE GAME ...

Having never beaten the Coasters before last season, it's now two home wins in succession for the Fleet against AFC Fylde – and this hugely welcome second win of the campaign plunged the 2023 National North champions right back into the relegation dogfight. Fylde had their moments in the opening and closing stages of the match but Fleet created several opportunities themselves with George Moncur and Franklin Domi having half chances in the first-half. The better moments came in the second period through Domi and Moncur again, while substitute Rakish Bingham almost converted with his first touch on 61 minutes.

THE GOAL ...

48' – From a corner, Ben Chapman picks the ball up on the left of the box. He floats a hanging cross to the far post where Josh Passley takes advantage of goalkeeper Ben Winterbottom's flap at the ball and heads back across goal. The ball lands for Domi to hit the target and Alex Lankshear makes sure of it over the line.

ONLINE MAN OF THE MATCH ...

A second online man of the match win in a row for Lankshear as he bagged 43% of the vote ahead of Aaron Bolger's 20%. Fine work for a clean sheet, his first goal for the club, three points... and a dislocated shoulder!
